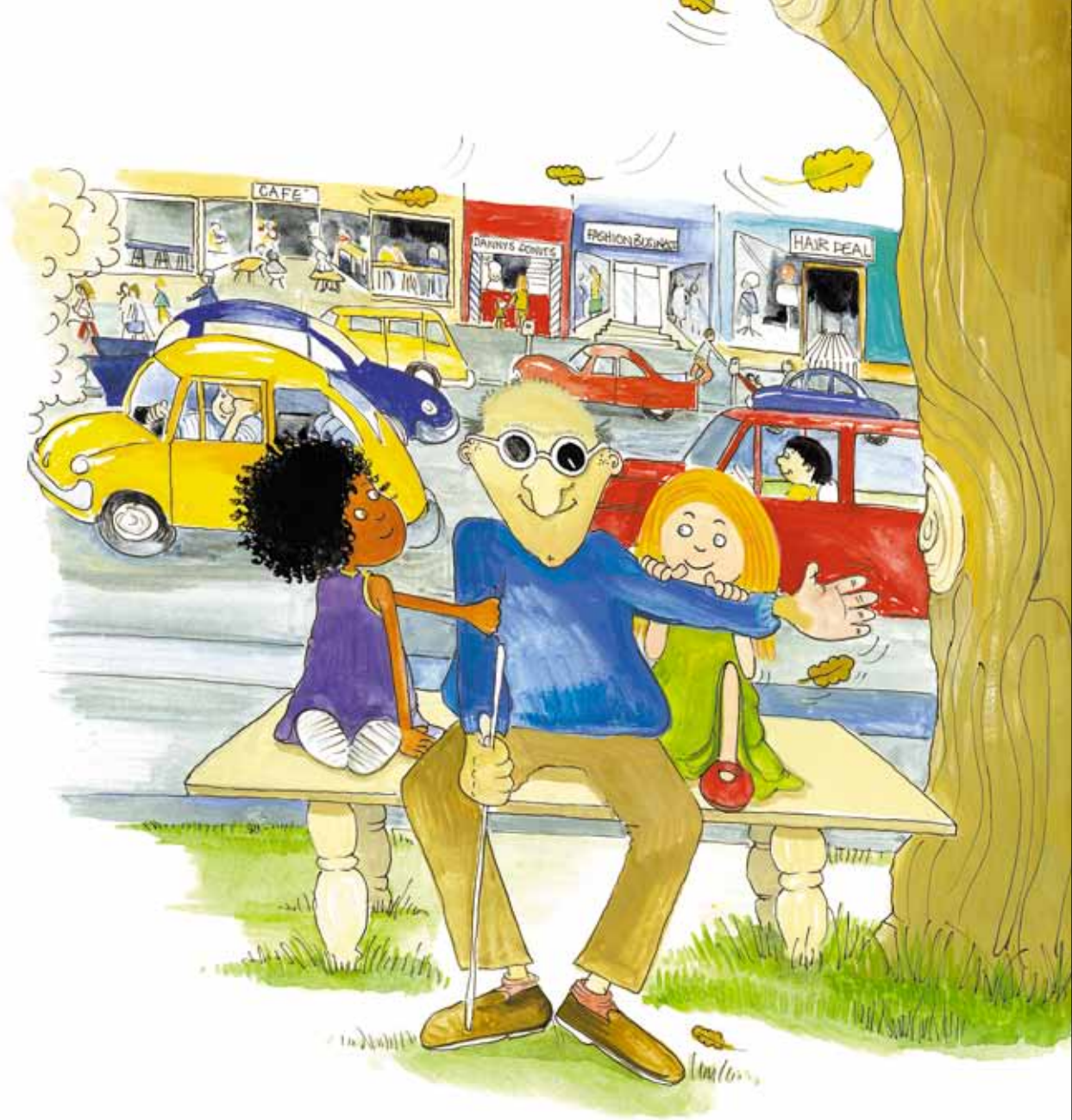

“Good morning,” he said. “Have you come to find peace and joy?”

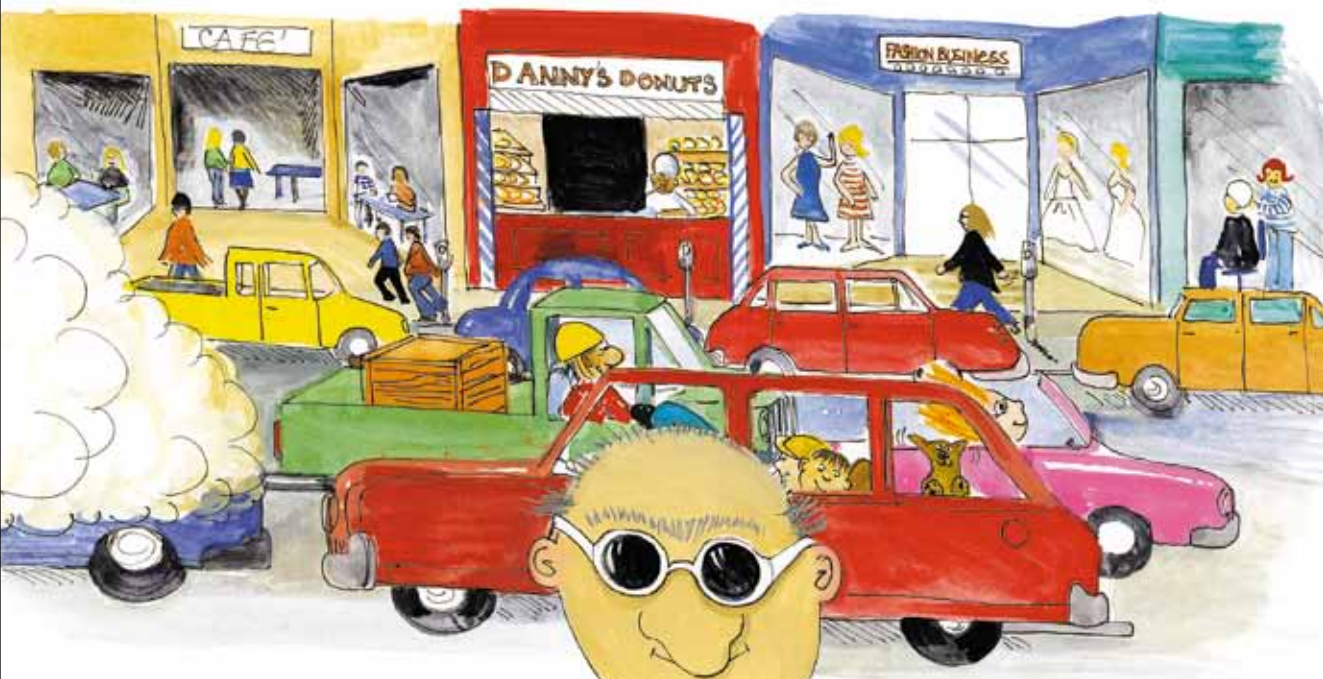


“Who are peace and joy?” asked Milly and Molly.
