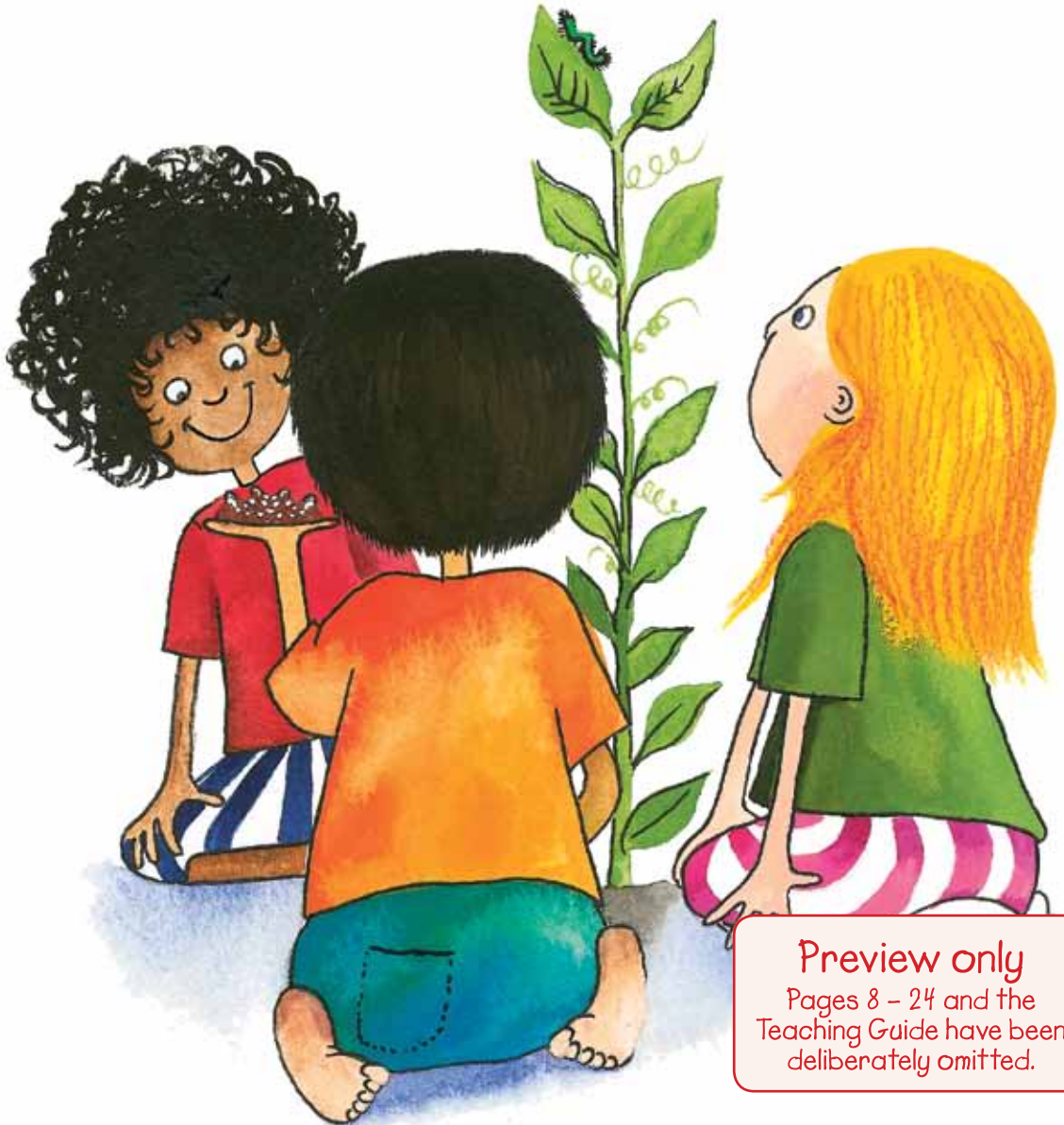

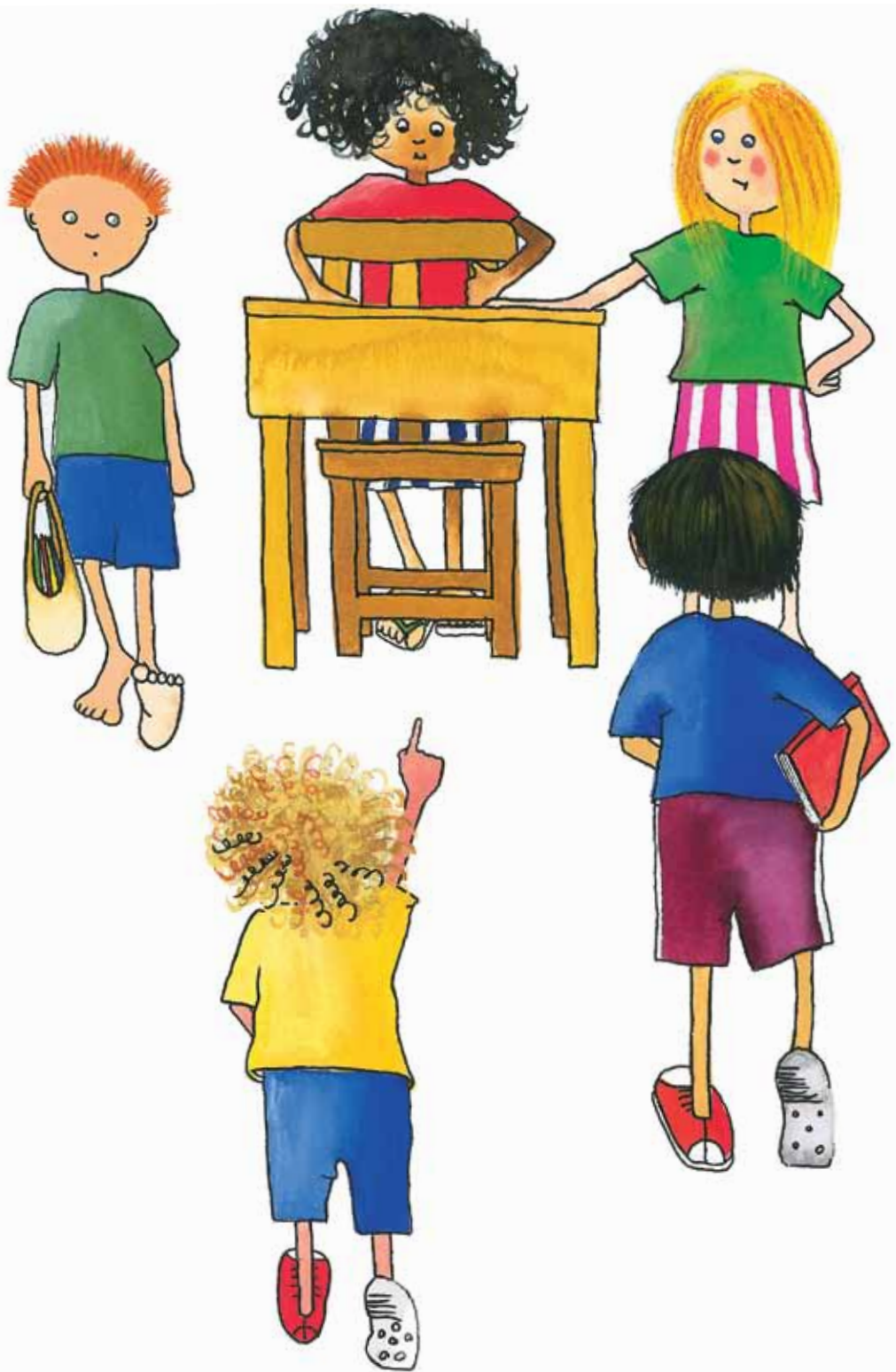
But best of all, Jimmy loved growing plants. He always had something growing in a pot or a packet of seeds in his pocket.
