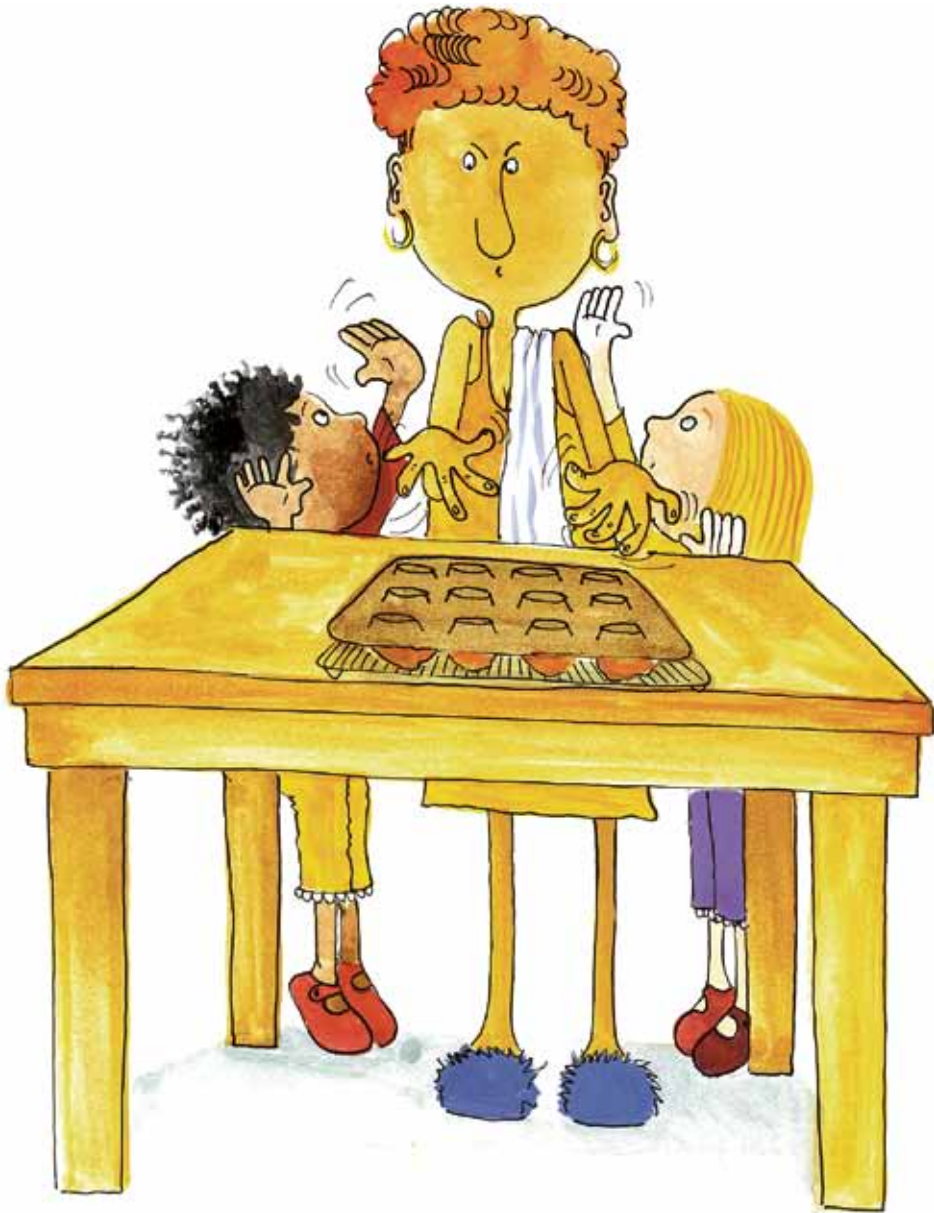

and Molly.



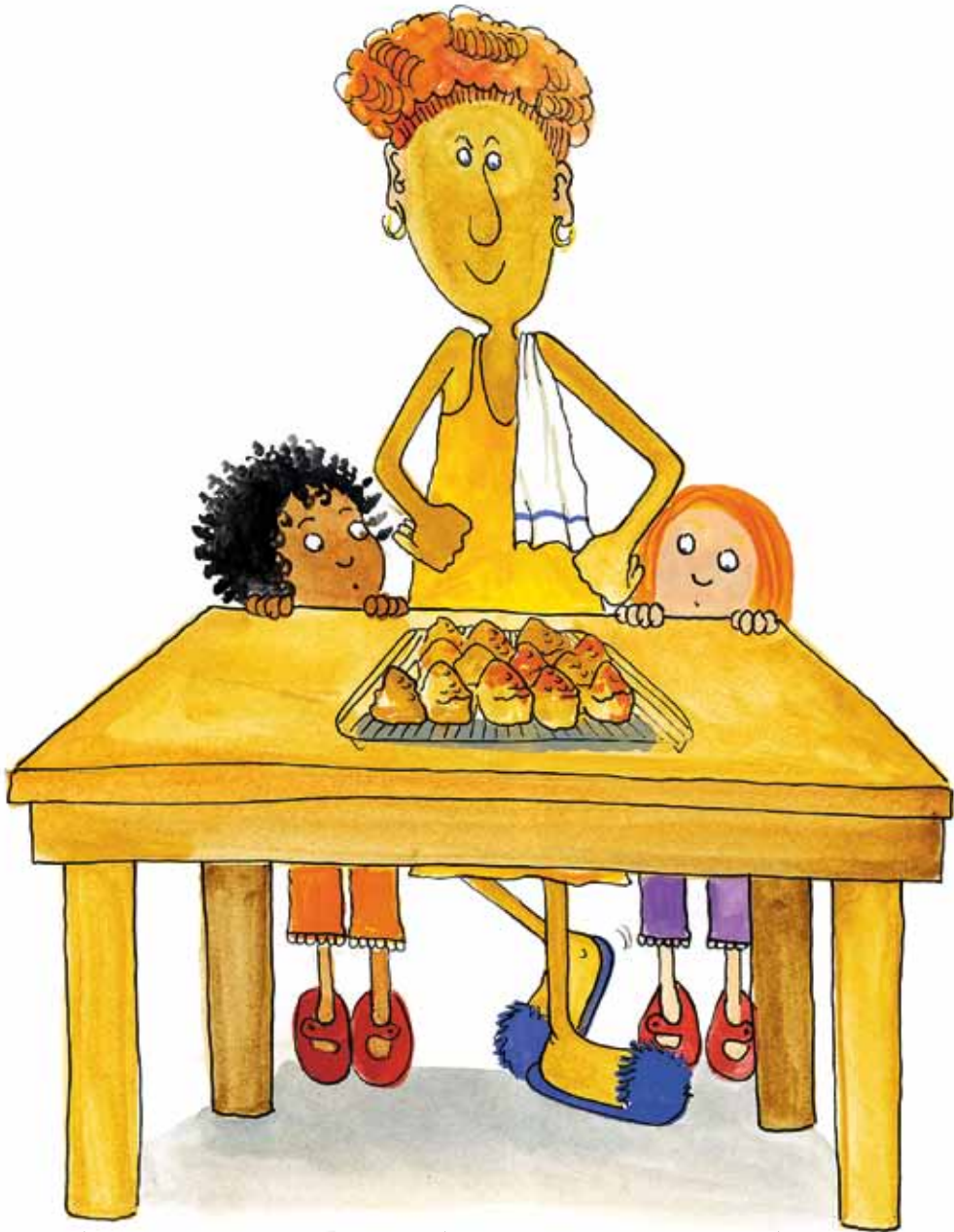
“Outcha come... outcha come...outcha
