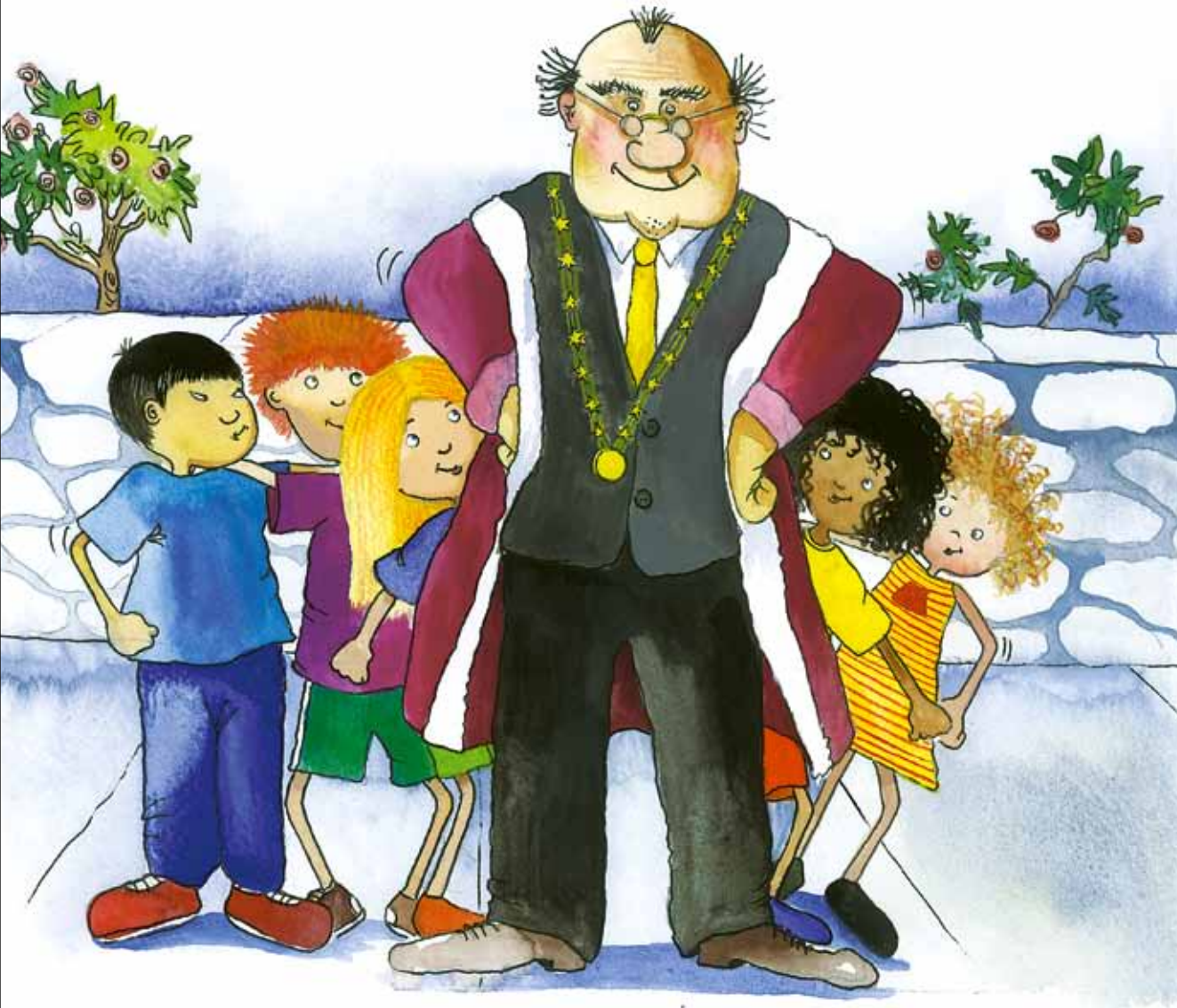

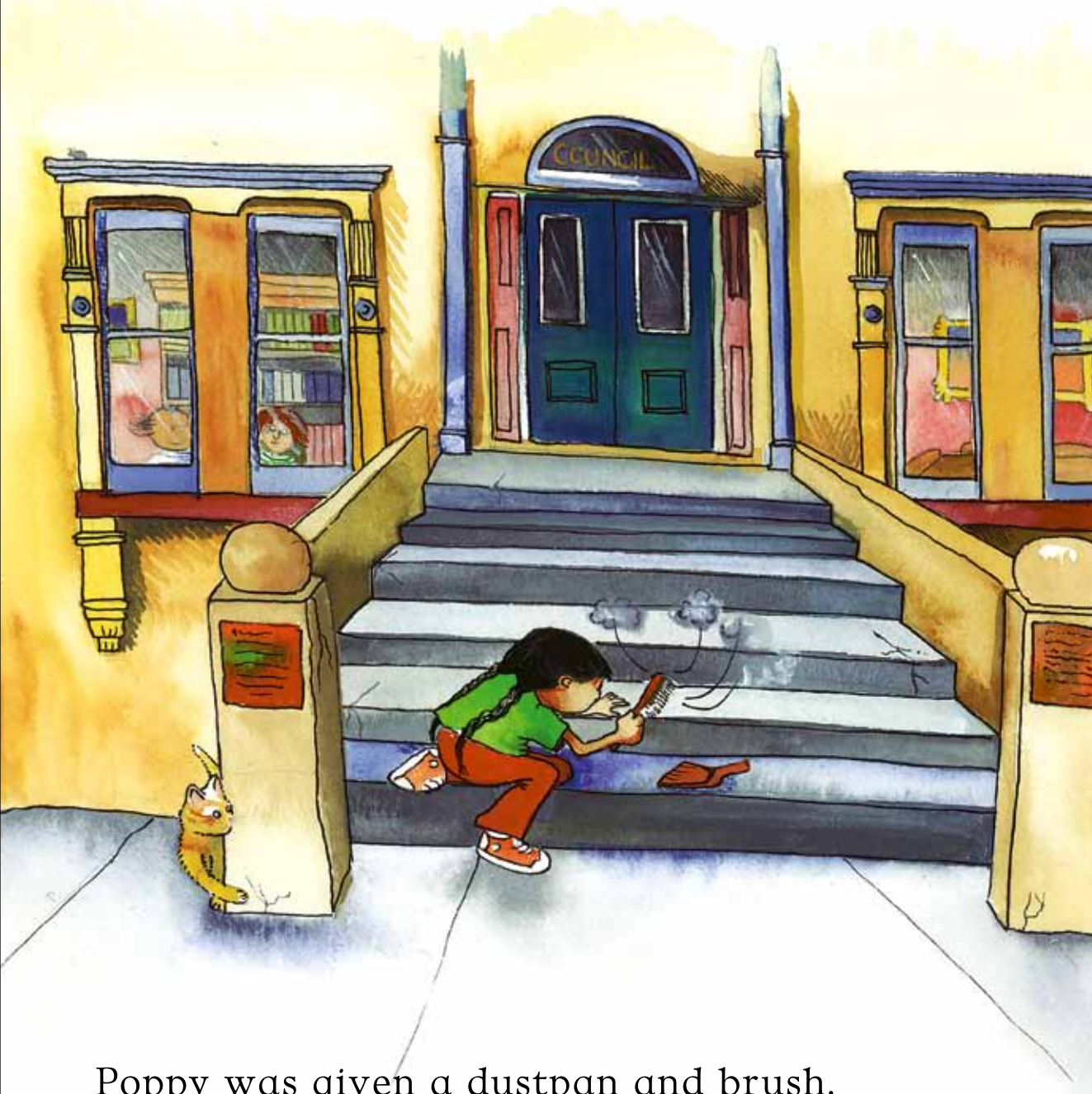
There was a feeling of great excitement.
