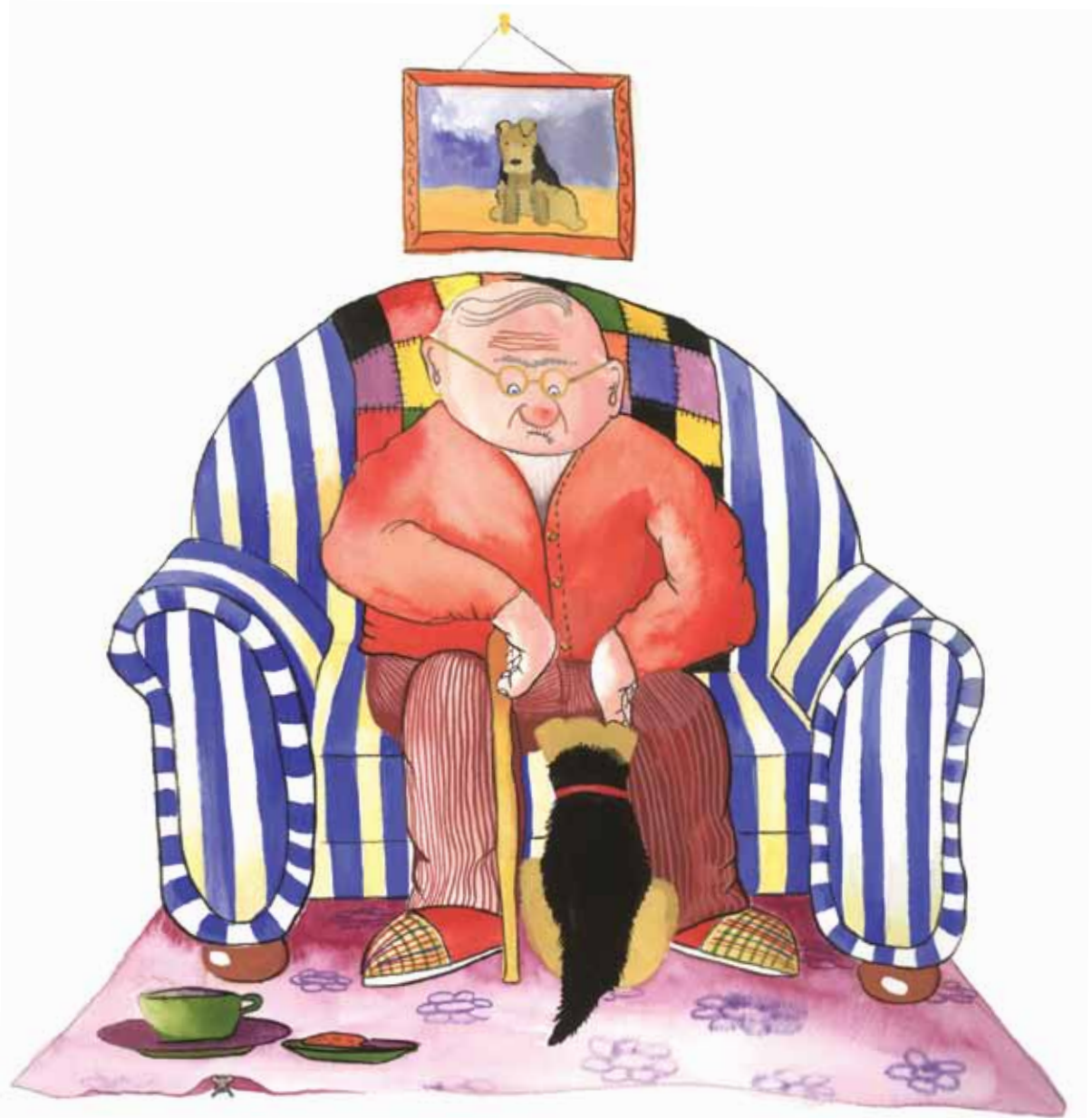

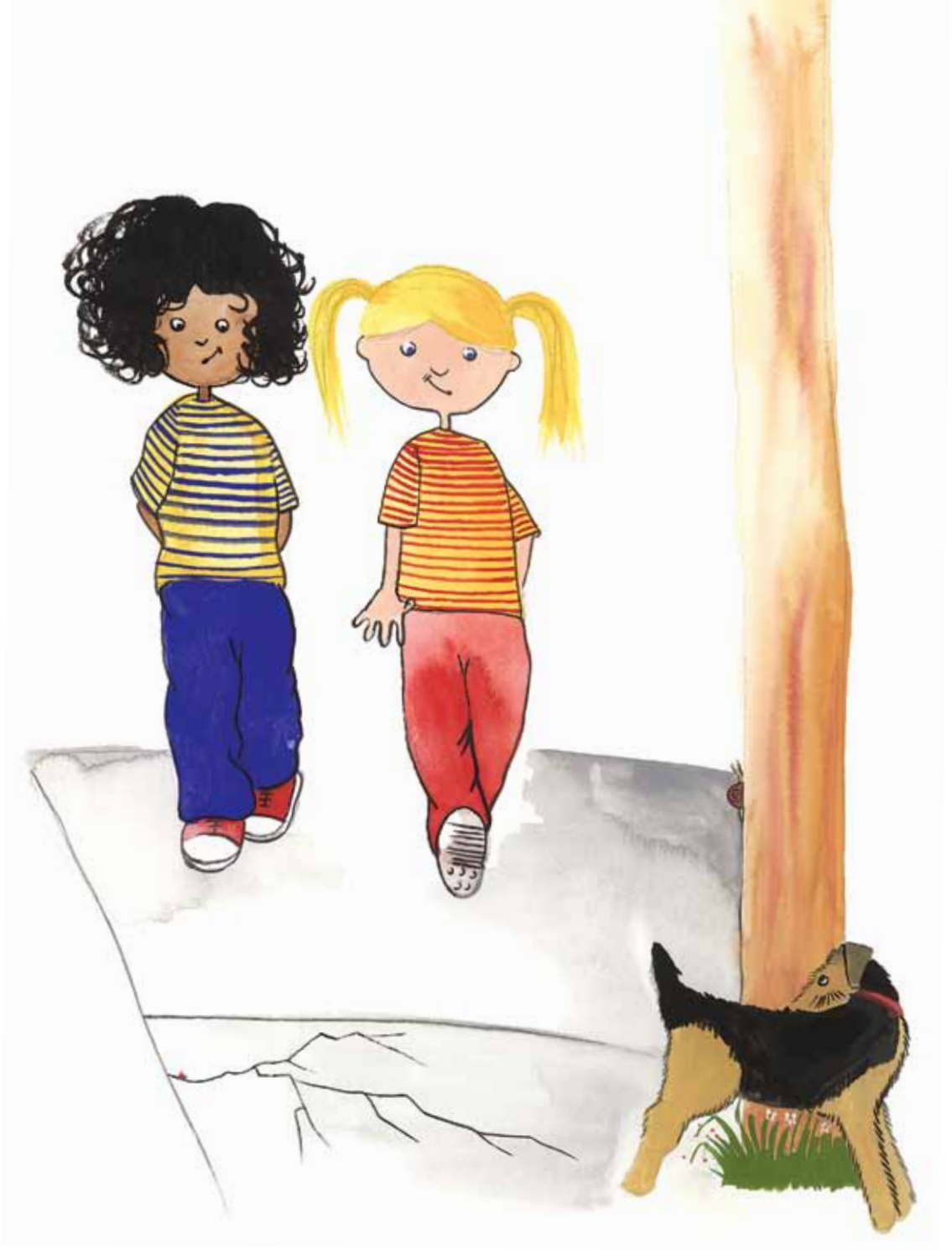
Mr. Limpy had tired old legs. It worried him that he couldn't walk Taffy Bogle.

They stopped at all the lampposts.

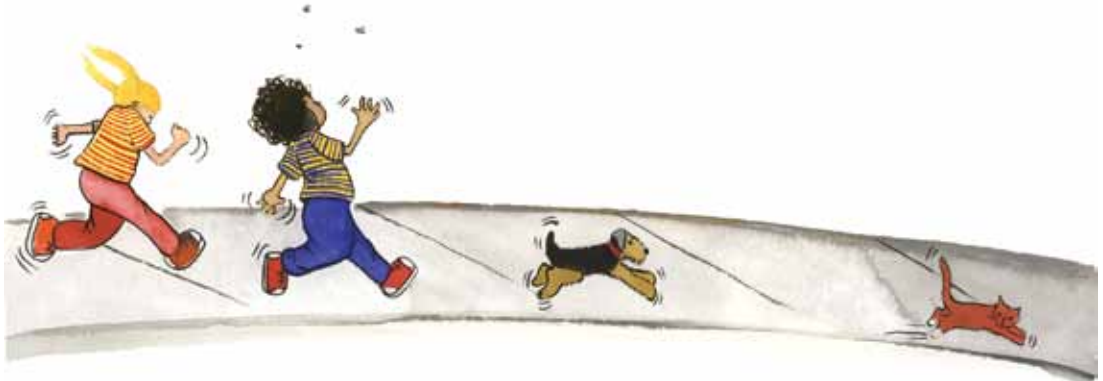


They talked to all the other dogs...
